Land Reclamation

Boxley Blue Ridge quarry's reclamation project was recognized as one of the best in the state by the Virginia Department of Energy (DOE) and the Virginia Transportation Construction Alliance. Boxley's best practice of ongoing reclamation of overburden or spoil piles exceeds Virginia DOE standards for safety, stability, environmental responsibility, and appearance. The quarry operation meets 100% of its water production needs from captured rain and storm water which is recycled for stone washing and dust suppression.

Water Conservation

Aggregate

Capture rainwater and channel stormwater runoff in the quarry pits and utilize closed-loop water recycling systems for stone washing, washout, dust suppression and truck wheel washing.

Asphalt

Minimal water used in production and clean-up process.

Block

Zero wastewater is generated in the block production process. Water used to wash out mixers is recycled and used for the production process.

Slate

Captured rainwater and channel stormwater runoff stored in old quarries is used to cool saws for cutting slate and dust suppression. Gray water is then cycled back into the same quarries which act like settling/sediment ponds and water is used again.



Focus on Stem Education

Supporting access to STEM education is a focus area for Boxley's charitable giving. Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) skills prepare young people for fast-growing occupations, including those in the construction materials industry.

Community College Access Program

Committed \$10,000 to the Community College Access Program (CCAP). This public/private partnership pays the cost of tuition for underserved high school graduates, including support for workforce



credentials, for three years at Virginia Western Community College. All CCAP participants are required to volunteer in their community each semester.

Virginia Museum of Natural History

Boxley's science outreach partnership with the Virginia Museum of Natural History delivered STEM-based educational programs to 2,159 students led by VMNH educators, scientists and research staff.



Boxley's Explore the Earth

Boxley's **Explore the Earth** program teaches students about geology firsthand with a quarry tour and in an engaging presentation by our engineers and environmental experts as to the role aggregate plays in daily life and how it is produced.



338 items and \$160.00 in monetary donations distributed to community food banks.






